Alcohol and Drug Addiction

Charlotte Behavioral Health Care

- **Crisis Services/Central Receiving Facility:** The Crisis Stabilization Unit is a comfortable facility that provides assessment and treatment services 24/7 for adults and children including a detox program.
- **Drug Court:** An intensive use program for patients with non-violent criminal drug charges. Involves supervision by DOC Probation, group and individual substance use therapy, involvement in the community peer recovery support groups, weekly drug screens, and court appearances.
- **Florida Assertive Community Treatment (FACT):** The FACT program serves adults with severe and persistent mental illness who may also have a co-occurring substance use disorder.
- **Family Intensive Treatment Team (FIT):** The FIT Team provides team-based, family-focused, comprehensive services for caregivers within the child welfare system who have been identified as having a substance use disorder.
- **Integrated Response for Intervention and Support (IRIS):** The IRIS Team responds to certain calls for service and assists our community with mental health/substance abuse related calls.
- **Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT):** MAT employs FDA-approved medications to treat life-threatening chronic brain diseases like Opiate Use Disorder.
- **MAT Support Group:** Offers free open discussion and support among recovery peers.
- **Recovery Center:** The Residential Rehabilitation Program serves people 18 years of age and older who seek intensive treatment services to address their current substance dependency.
- **Seeking Safety:** This program is designed to help people attain safety from all types of trauma and/or addiction.

- **The Scent Preservation Kit:** Scent kits are utilized by families and law enforcement to help bring a lost family member back home. With the Scent Kit, it only takes a few minutes to swipe, seal, and store a person's unique odor. If a loved one wanders off, caretakers will be ready with an uncontaminated scent article for K9 responders to begin searching for them.
- **Take Me Home:** If a loved one has gone missing and they are signed up in this program, the Sheriff's Office can immediately get the photo and description out on the street to search more accurately. Take Me Home is free to all Charlotte County Citizens.
